Why OVN?

Virtual networking for Open vSwitch
built by the Open vSwitch community

Cloud management systems agnostic

Scalability and efficiency

East/West Distributed Routing
by default

North/South Routing HA
by default

OpenFlow

Hardware offload

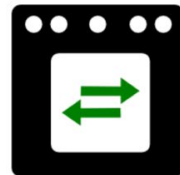
TLS/RBAC on control plane by default

Native DNS & DHCP

Active community

Vendor neutral

Integration with hardware network
infrastructure possible (OVSDB
Hardware VTEP)



Planning for a migration

Versions and prerequisites

- Neutron adopted the ML2 OVN driver into the main tree at OpenStack Ussuri
- Recommended upgrade path is to first upgrade to OpenStack Ussuri on Ubuntu Focal or Bionic
- Then perform migration from ML2+OVS to ML2+OVN
- Use of openvswitch firewall driver prior to migration is required



MTU

- OVN uses Geneve tunnels
- GRE overhead = 22 bytes
- VXLAN overhead = 30 bytes
- Geneve overhead = 38 bytes
- Does your cloud have available headroom for the increase of packet size?
- Instances using DHCP can automatically reduce MTU by changing configuration
- Requires time to pass for instances to renew lease, typically 24 hours
- Instances using IPv6 SLAAC automatically adjust MTU when OVN takes over control
- Statically configured instances require end user intervention prior to migration



IP Allocations and DNS

- Make sure all your subnets have free IP addresses for allocation
- OVN handles instance access to DNS differently, make sure all subnets are configured correctly
